Dear Skyline Property Owners Association Members:

Most property owners should be able to get to their property now. Exceptions would be around the top & back side of the Gooseberry Loop and the end of Nina's Way beyond Milligan's cabin. As of last Saturday, there was still a fair amount of snow along those roads & there are several blown down trees tht must be cut & moved to the side before vehicle access will be possible. The switchback side to the Granger East Stake property up Huntington Creek also has many blown down trees that must be removed. Finally, all should know that there has been somewhat of a road wash-out at the horseshoe bend along Brooks Canyon just before the road begins the steep incline. Most cars may be able to be driven through the wash-out along the culvert, but a higher clearance vehicle such as a truck or SUV would be best until this area can be repaired. The slide in front of Cunningham's cabin along Quakey Mtn Road will not prevent vehicle travel, but it is narrow & may be difficult in wet weather until the slide is removed.
