Dear Skyline Property Owners Association Members:

We are very close to being able to get in by vehicle. We traveled up the mountain again yesterday. I would guess that the corner just before the East Side entrance gate will be melted off enough by this Friday or Saturday to at least allow 4 wheel drive vehicles to get by; maybe even cars, but I'm afraid it could still be quite muddy around that corner. There may still even be a bit of snow on the road there. The road up Huntington Creek and through the meadow, as well as around Brooks Canyon should be fine. Quaky Mtn Road should be mostly dry, but there is a slide in front of Cunningham's cabin that will prevent any safe vehicle traffic other than ATVs until the slide is cleared. Elk Hollow is still snow packed & in my opinion it is doubtful that vehicles will be able to use the road by this weekend. I assume that the West Side FS Road is still closed because yesterday there appeared to be a truck parked in the road leading down from the Fairview Canyon parking lot. Status of the FS Road opening is unknown at this time.

The Board will be meeting this Wednesday night for its second meeting since the Spring Banquet was held. Any of your thoughts or ideas for discussion by the Board should be discussed with or preferably sent to a Board Member ASAP.

An Association Roads Committee will be formed soon with Scott Halton serving as the Chairman of that committee. An assessment of road work that needs to be done will be completed as soon as Scott & other road committee members can get up on the mountain to do so. If you have a desire to serve on the Association Roads Committee, then please contact Scott Halton or Carol Thomsen immediately.

The Fire Safety Committee will need to be re-organized soon with Gary Manville serving as the Board Member representative on that committee. I hope that current members of that committee will continue to serve and be actively involved with the remaining work that needs to be done in conjunction with the Utah DNR pertaining to the grant we received due to the past efforts of the Fire Safety Committee. If you have a desire to serve on the Fire Safety Committee, then please contact Gary Manville or Carol Thomsen immediately.

We will keep Association Members informed via the website, as regularly as possible, regarding issues of importance such as road status and fire safety matters, etc. We will continue to occasionally mail-out a Newsletter, but the website will now be the primary means of the Board communicating with the Association Membership.
